TIER 1	<p>All nurseries, childminders, schools, colleges and other educational establishments should remain open and continue to allow all their children and young people to attend, on site, with no other restrictions in place.</p>	<p>The college will continue to operate as normal with a blended approach and learners attending every week. The nursery will remain open as normal.</p>	<p>None, the current arrangements remain in place.</p>
TIER 2	<p>Secondary schools move to a rota model. Further education (FE) providers should adopt similar principles with discretion to decide on a model that limits numbers on site but works for each individual setting.</p>	<p>The college will move to a one-week rota system for students and staff. Arrangements for remote delivery are already in place. The nursery will remain open as normal.</p>	<p>Learners would have one week of complete remote delivery. By splitting the college in this way, it effectively creates a nine-day isolation window and reduces risk of transmission.</p>
TIER 3	<p>FE colleges and other educational establishments would allow full-time on-site provision only to vulnerable children, the children of critical workers and selected year groups (to be identified by Department for Education).</p>	<p>The college will transition to full remote delivery with staff on site to support vulnerable children, key workers and any year group together with the core functions of the college. The nursery will remain open as normal.</p>	<p>Learners, unless in the designated groups would work completely remotely.</p>
TIER 4	<p>All nurseries, childminders, mainstream schools, colleges and other educational establishments allow full-time attendance on site only to our priority groups: vulnerable children and the children of critical workers. All other pupils should not attend on site.</p>	<p>The college will transition to full remote delivery with staff on site to support vulnerable children and key workers with the core functions of the college. The nursery will be open for priority groups - vulnerable children and the children of critical workers</p>	<p>Learners, unless in the designated groups would work completely remotely.</p>
