PROGRAMME DESCRIPTION

The objective of this qualification is to develop the knowledge and skills needed when working in a lead adult care worker role in care settings. It covers a wide range of areas including supporting individuals with their physical and emotional care, daily living needs and health and social care procedures.

This is a combined knowledge and competence qualification which is aimed at individuals who would like to develop the skills and knowledge necessary to become a Senior Carer. In particular, this level 3 qualification would be most appropriate for aspiring Senior Carers.

PROGRAMME CONTENT

This course includes the following core mandatory content:

- Promote communication in care settings
- Promote effective handling of information in care settings
- Promote personal development in care settings
- Promote person-centred approaches in care settings
- Promote equality and inclusion in care settings
- Promote health, safety and wellbeing in care settings
- Responsibilities of a care worker
- Duty of care in care settings
- Safeguarding and protection in care settings

Optional content will be selected by learners from a wide range of additional units.

DELIVERY AND ASSESSMENT

The qualification will be delivered as a blended model and will include knowledge delivery via Microsoft Teams, independent study, 1-1 meetings with your tutor and observations within the workplace.

This qualification is assessed by portfolio of evidence with learners achieving either pass or fail. Successful learners will have to demonstrate knowledge, understanding and skills across the breadth of the qualification syllabus. The portfolio of evidence will be internally quality assured by Loughborough College.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

This qualification is suitable for learners aged 19+. Whilst there is no formal entry criteria with regard to English and Maths Qualifications, it is advised that you have a minimum of Level 1 English to complete the course. If you cannot provide proof of a Level 1 English qualification a small written task will be set to establish the skills needed.

Learners will need to be working, volunteering or on a practical placement as an important part of the assessment process involves evaluating skills in real working situations.

PROGRESSION

After completing this qualification, learners could progress on to Level 4 Diploma in Adult Care. This qualification is aimed at individuals who would like to develop the skills and knowledge necessary to supervise within adult care settings. In particular, this level 4 qualification would be most appropriate for existing senior carers for further development or for those aspiring to become managers.

FUNDING

From April 2021, any adult aged 24 and over who wants to achieve their first full level 3 qualification, which is equivalent to an advanced technical certificate or diploma, or 2 full A levels, will be able to access hundreds of fully-funded courses including this one, as part of the National Skills Fund 'Lifetime Skills Guarantee'.

19 to 23 year olds will continue to be eligible for their first full level 3 via the adult education budget, and for any additional qualifications made available through this offer.
