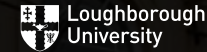

# Course levels explained

We offer a variety of routes through higher education. Below you'll find explanations of the routes we offer and why these are beneficial to your learning and development.

## Honours Degree

We offer full three-year honours degree courses, with our partner universities. Although you will study at Loughborough College, your final qualification will be awarded by the validating university itself and will be equivalent to receiving a degree directly from them.

## Foundation Degree

Foundation Degrees have been designed together with employers to meet the growing demand for skilled people who can apply an enhanced understanding of their subject in the workplace. You can either enter employment after completing the course or choose to "Top Up" to a full honours degree.

## HNC/HND

The BTEC Higher National Certificate (HNC) and Higher National Diploma (HND) are established qualifications that are widely recognised and highly regarded. We offer these in various, flexible modes of study, including part-time, block release, or evening options.

## Honours Degree Top-Up

Successful HND or Foundation Degree students who meet entry requirements are eligible to progress on to a one-year, full-time course at Loughborough College, designed to "top up" their current qualification to a full honours degree, awarded by our partner universities.

## Professional Qualifications & Training

We have a wide range of full-time and part-time professional courses which give you the opportunity to update your skills and study career-related courses. Many of these courses lead to qualifications awarded by a variety of professional bodies, including the:

# Campus facilities

## Undergraduate Centre

## Engineering Laboratories

## Institute of Technology

**In partnership with Loughborough University, University of Derby, and Derby College; we have secured £13m of funding to become the home of the East Midlands Institute of Technology.**

Courses will specialise in programmes such as Engineering and Manufacturing Technologies; Information and Communication Technology; Science and Mathematics and Construction, Planning and the built environment. It will prepare students for Industry 4.0 and the UK's carbon-neutral future.



## Sports Hub

A new state-of-the-art Sports Hub is set to further enhance elite-level training facilities offered at Loughborough College.

The College has secured £9.91 million from the Department for Education (DfE) to create a new three-storey, 3,000sqm facility as part of a wide range of multi-million pound improvements on its Radmoor Road campus.

The new building will house a modern sports hall with a viewing terrace and outstanding changing facilities. It will also feature contemporary classrooms, flexible learning spaces, breakout areas and a small staff base.

## Digital Skills Hub

**Loughborough College's exciting new Digital Skills Hub will provide quality teaching facilities, which aim to boost the skills of our communities and ensure the local and regional economy has the workforce needed to support Industry 4.0.**

As well as boosting skills, the Hub will also work with employers to deliver a greater breadth of work placement opportunities and better support regional industry.

The Digital Skills Hub will also aim to deliver:

- T-Levels, Apprenticeships and Kickstart job placements to skill-up local people as Loughborough moves into a more digitally focused future
- Target unemployed and semi-skilled adults to support them into employment
- Equip the next generation with the skills and knowledge to improve social mobility, human capital and economic success
- Reduction in local travel to access skills, contributing to our commitment to clean growth and carbon reductions in Loughborough

## Exercise Physiology Laboratory



Our state-of-the-art physiology lab is equipped with high-spec treadmills and exercise ergometers, allowing Sports students to gain an applied insight into the physiological changes associated with exercise. The lab is also equipped for gas analysis, haematological assessment, and measures of hydration, as well as body composition techniques. High-speed cameras and a pressure plate also allow for the analysis of human performance from a biomechanical perspective.

## Strength and Conditioning Suite

Our newly renovated strength and conditioning suite offers students the opportunity to demonstrate and coach key movements such as Olympic lifts, in line with the internationally recognised

UK Strength and Conditioning Accreditation (UKSCA). Further to this, the suite provides students with the opportunity to practically apply other concepts such as plyometric training and weightlifting.

## Sport and Exercise Therapy Teaching Suites

Our two sport and exercise therapy suites are state-of-the-art facilities containing therapy beds and equipment, TVs, and software to rival any in the country.

A major investment was made in the sports therapy suite to enhance the facilities it offers to degree students studying the BSc (Hons) Sport and Exercise Therapy degree course.

As well as a contemporary classroom environment, the new Sport & Exercise Therapy Teaching Suite creates a perfect platform for excellent practical and theory lectures enhancing learning.



## Golf Studio

The Loughborough College Golf Studio boasts Foresight Sports GCQuad technology, facilitating expert golf swing analysis and a professional golf coaching environment. The Golf Studio is utilised for teaching across the sports degree programmes, as well as private and team coaching.

## Arts Academy

The Arts Academy provides undergraduate students on the Music course with state-of-the-art facilities, with industry-standard recording studios, equipment, and rehearsal spaces.

- Differentiate activities to account for different starting points to ensure learners are engaged and making progress.
- Ensure all learners contribute during group discussions by supporting and encouraging participation so that students can develop their thinking and communication skills.
- Use your raised awareness of your own unconscious biases to treat all students fairly.
- Consistently apply classroom and college rules so that all students are treated fairly.
- **Respect contributions made by students so that they feel valued.**
- **Show empathy and understanding for students' personal situations to adapt learning and assessment strategies.**
- **Encourage students to listen to one another's contributions to foster an atmosphere of mutual respect.**
- **Encourage students to respect the lived experience of others with protected characteristics to develop empathy and understanding.**
- **Encourage students to interact with those around them by fully engaging without distractions such as mobile phones.**
- **Create a safe and dignified environment where students feel able to take risks and make mistakes without negative consequences.**
- **Encourage students to listen to others with curiosity and show respect for opinions that may differ from their own.**
- Show all students that they have the same access to a high-quality education by signposting them to support where it is needed e.g., the student bursary.
- Avoid using stereotypical resources/ examples to raise aspirations for all.
- Model expectations on how people should treat one another to set strong standards.
- Set high expectations for all students in line with their aspirational target grades regardless of their circumstances, abilities, or experiences to provide maximum opportunities for learning.
- Ensure accessibility of resources so that everyone has an equal opportunity to learn.
- Offer alternative forms of assessment such as voice or video recordings, presentations or blogs wherever possible to meet individual needs.



- **When using images in classroom delivery ensure that all members of the global community are represented to reflect the diversity of our college.**
- **Give examples of inspirational vocational/academic/technical role models that include people with protected characteristics to promote equality of opportunity.**
- **Wherever possible utilise key events on the diversity calendar into classroom delivery and assessment planning to celebrate students' heritage.**
- **Role model that differences should be respected, recognised and valued because diversity brings strength.**
- Create a sense of social belonging by getting students involved in departmental and college events so that they feel part of the college community.
- Maintain a welcoming classroom environment that showcases student achievements, exemplar work to inspire a sense of belonging.
- Use students' preferred forms of address, for example names, gender identities, titles etc.
- Include relatable material in the creation of classroom resources to provide students with a solid foundation for learning.
- Celebrate students' prior experiences by giving them the opportunity to share so that they are making a positive contribution.
- Include student voice in the planning and delivery of subject content so that students feel a sense of ownership and empowerment of their learning.
- Plan a variety of teaching activities to encourage engagement through excitement for learning.
- Complete continuous professional development to ensure up-to-date practices are used when planning, delivering and assessing to promote engagement.
